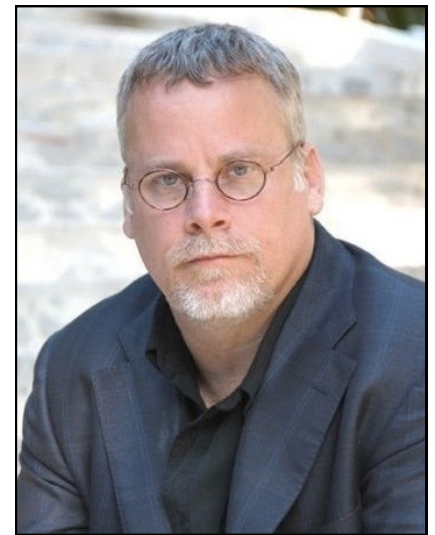

Deal Breaker by Harlan Coben

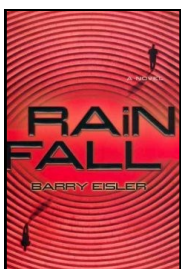
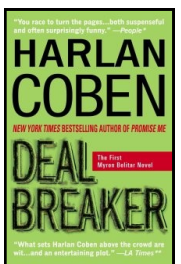
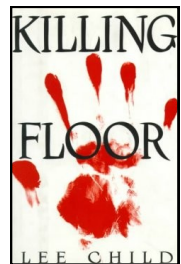
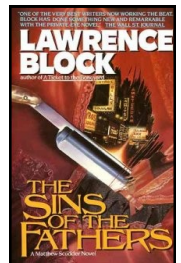

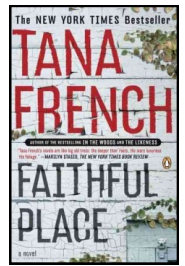
Rain Fall by Barry Eisler

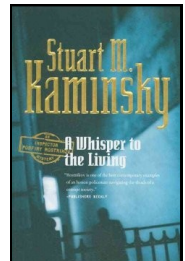
Faithful Place by Tana French

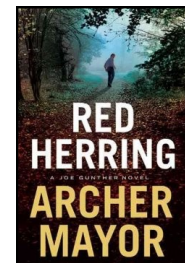
A Whisper to the Living by Stuart Kaminsky

Inspector Porfiry Petrovich Rostnikov, an honest policeman in a very dishonest post-Soviet Union, and his team search for a serial killer who has claimed at least 40 victims while protecting a visiting British journalist who is working on a story about a Moscow prostitution ring that produces leads to a high-level source seemingly beyond Rostnikov's reach.



A Drink Before the War by Dennis Lehane

Private detective partners Patrick Kenzie and Angela Gennaro are hired to find Jenna Angeline, a missing black cleaning woman who allegedly stole confidential state documents, but as their investigation becomes complicated by rival gang leaders, extortion, child prostitution, and assassination reaching to the highest levels of government, they discover that their target has been framed.

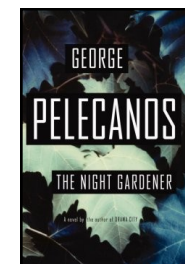


Red Herring by Archer Mayor

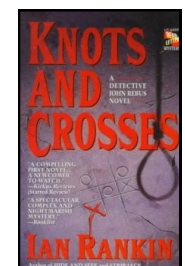
The Night Gardener by George Pelecanos

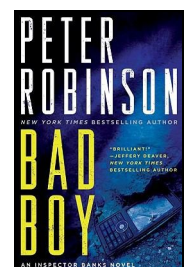
Knots and Crosses by Ian Rankin

A spectacular, complex, and nightmarish mystery novel that burrows beneath the historic facade of Edinburgh, Scotland's capital, to explore the city's violent, drug-saturated underbelly. For detective John Rebus, solving the "Edinburgh Strangler" murders of four young girls has evolved into a hunt for an old friend now transformed into a vengeful enemy.



Bad Boy Peter Robinson

A distraught woman arrives at the Eastvale police station desperate to speak to Detective Chief Inspector Alan Banks. But since Banks is away on holiday, his partner, Annie Cabbot, steps in. The woman tells Annie that she's found a loaded gun hidden in the bedroom of her daughter, Erin - a punishable offense under English law. When an armed response team breaks into the house to retrieve the weapon, the seemingly straightforward procedure quickly spirals out of control. First in series: **Gallows View**
