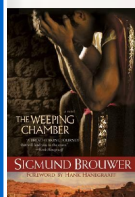
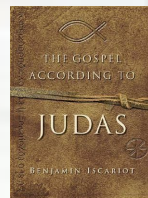


Novels About Jesus Christ

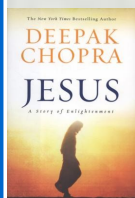


The Weeping Chamber by Sigmund Brouwer

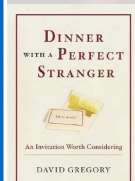
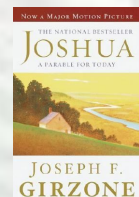


Jesus: A Story of Enlightenment by Deepak Chopra

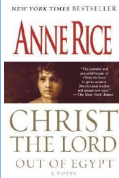
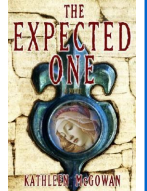


Welcoming Door by Kenny Kemp

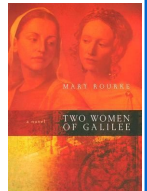


Christ The Lord: Out of Egypt by Anne Rice
