Lindy M. Brown was a Wake County Commissioner from 2006 to 2010. She became the youngest African American County Commissioner to serve on the Board. Lindy is the first elected official in her family. Born and raised in Wake County, Lindy graduated from Enloe High School, North Carolina Central University and the University of North Carolina's School of Social Work, where she received a Master's Degree. Her political career began in 1976, when she became a campaign volunteer for former Gov. Jim Hunt.
