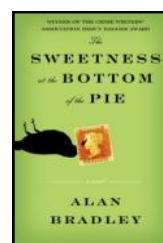
Evan Help Us by Rhys Bowen

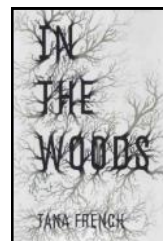


A Share in Death by Deborah Crombie

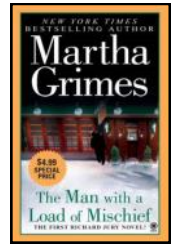
Death of an Irish Politician by Bartholomew Gill

Police officer Richard Jury investigates the deaths of two strangers at two English inns and finds the village's most distinguished citizens among the prime suspects.



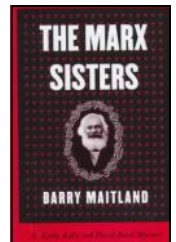
Haunted Ground by Erin Hart

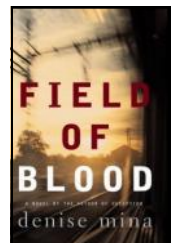


The Marx Sisters by Barry Maitland

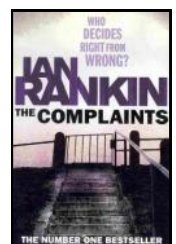


Field of Blood by Denise Mina

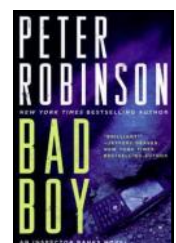


A Morbid Taste for Bones by Ellis Peters
