

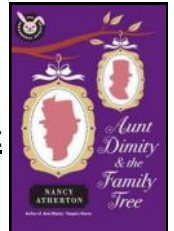

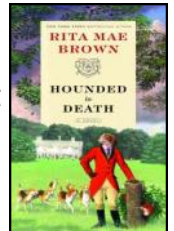
## **Aunt Dimity and the Family Tree by Nancy Atherton**

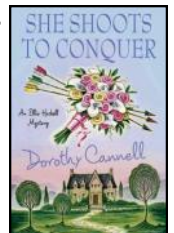
## **Busy Body by M.C. Beaton**

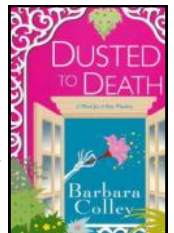
## **Hounded to Death by Rita Mae Brown**

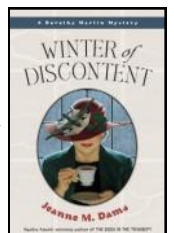


## **Dusted to Death by Barbara Colley**

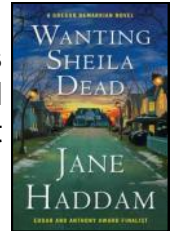

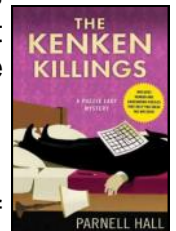
## Wanting Sheila Dead by Jane Haddam

## The Kenken Killings by Parnell Hall

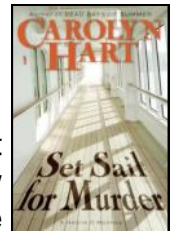

## Set Sail for Murder by Carolyn Hart

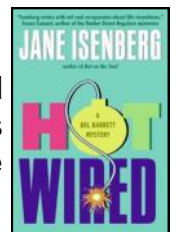

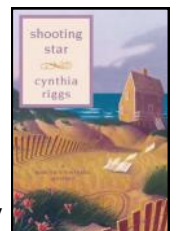


## Hot Wired by Jane Isenberg
