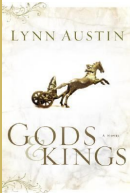


Biblical Fiction

These titles can be found in the Inspirational Fiction section of the library.

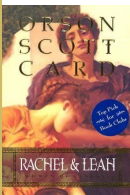


Gods and Kings by Lynn N. Austin

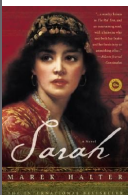
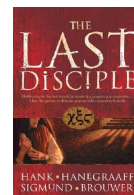


Rachel and Leah: Women of Genesis by Orson Scott Card

This third book of Card's *Women of Genesis* series traces the intertwined lives of four women celebrated in the Bible: Leah, oldest daughter of Laban; Leah's beautiful sister Rachel; Bilhah, an orphan taken in by Laban; and Zilpah, a servant born into Laban's tribe.

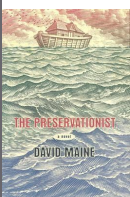


Sarah: a Novel by Marek Halter

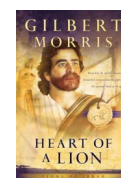


The Preservationist by David Maine

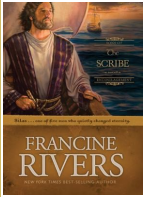

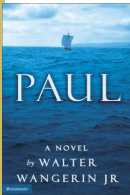
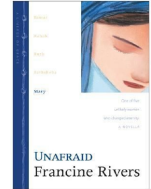


The Scribe by Francine Rivers

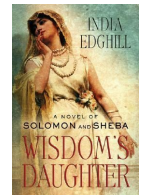


The Red Tent by Anita Diamant

The story of Dinah, a tragic character from the Bible whose great love, a prince, is killed by her brother, leaving her alone and pregnant. The novel traces her life from childhood to death, in the process examining sexual and religious practices of the day, and what it meant to be a woman.

Wisdom's Daughter: a Novel of Solomon and Sheba by India Edghill

A tale based on the biblical story of King Solomon and the Queen of Sheba follows the queen's search for an heir; the lessons Solomon and she learned about truth, love, and duty; and her daughter's efforts to achieve a position of power.



Eve: a novel of the first woman by Elissa Elliott

In the final days of her life, a widowed Eve looks back on her long and eventful life, including her early life in the Garden of Eden, her encounter with a beguiling Lucifer, her life with Adam and their children, and her yearning for God's forgiveness.

Mary, Called Magdalene by Margaret George

In a vivid re-creation of Mary Magdalene's life story, Margaret George convincingly captures this renowned woman's voice as she moves from girlhood to womanhood, becomes part of the circle of disciples, and comes to grips with the divine. Grounded in biblical scholarship and secular research, this fascinating historical novel is also, ultimately, "the diary of a soul."
