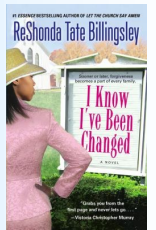


[The Amen Sisters](#) by Angela Benson

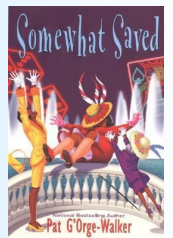


[Ain't No River](#) by Sharon Ewell Foster

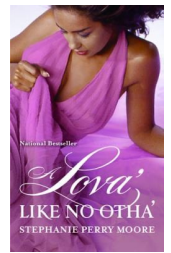
[Cover Girls](#) by T.D. Jakes

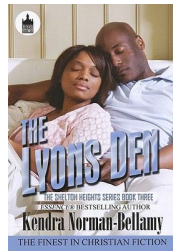


A Lova' Like No Otha' by Stephanie Perry Moore

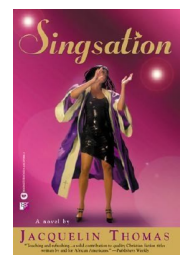


Divas of Damascus Road by Michelle Stimpson

Blaming God for all the hardships in her life, a young woman finally realizes that everything happens for a reason as she blossoms into a strong-willed and independent woman.

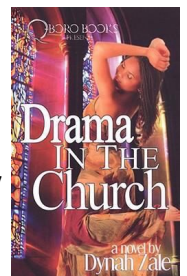


Singsation by Jacquelin Thomas
