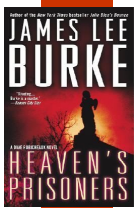


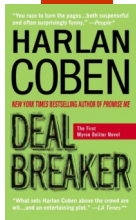

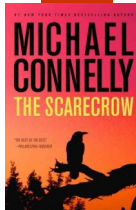
HEAVEN'S PRISONERS BY JAMES LEE BURKE

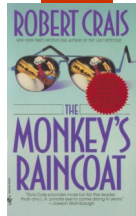
DEAL BREAKER BY HARLAN COBEN

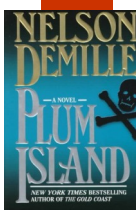
THE SCARECROW BY MICHAEL CONNELLY

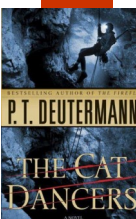
THE MONKEY'S RAINCOAT BY ROBERT CRAIS

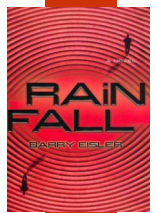

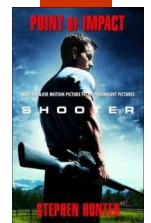
[EVEN](#) BY ANDREW GRANT

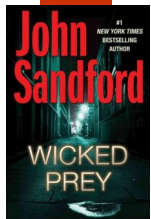
[KILL CLAUSE](#) BY GREGG HURWITZ
