DO NOT take any fish from
**Lake Crabtree, or Crabtree Creek, just
above or below the lake.**

The State Department of Health and Human Services has warned the public not to eat any catfish or carp from the lake. Routinely eating fish from the lake or the creek may increase your risk of:

- Cancer
- Infections
- Skin problems (including cracked fingernails)
- Learning problems in children born to women who eat fish from these waters.

High levels of chemicals (PCBs) have been found in the fish.

If you have routinely eaten fish from these waters, and have questions about your health, please call your doctor or Dr. Luanne Williams with the North Carolina Department of Health and Human Services at 919-707-5912.

You may catch and release fish

There is no known risk to human health from catch and release fishing, swimming, boating, or other recreational activities on, or near, the lake. If future testing reveals new information, then new advice will be given and new signs will be posted. Swimming is not allowed at Lake Crabtree County Park.
