Dirk Gently's Holistic Detective Agency by Douglas Adams

For Dirk Gently, private detective, the search for a missing cat uncovers a bewildered ghost, a secret time traveler, and a devastating secret that threatens the future of humanity. Also try the sequel: [The Long Dark Tea-Time of the Soul](#).

Bearing an Hourglass by Piers Anthony

A disillusioned wanderer becomes the incarnation of Time, destined to live from present to past. At the same time, he must somehow prevent Satan from dominating the human world.

City at the End of Time by Greg Bear

Unable to recall anything about their own pasts, three young people living in modern-day Seattle share a disturbing vision of a far-future, decaying cityscape and are each drawn into a desperate mission to preserve their own universe.

Kindred by Octavia Butler

Inexplicably pulled back in time to the antebellum South, a contemporary Black woman, raised in the age of Civil Rights and Black Power, must confront the harsh realities of Black history in America.

Pastwatch by Orson Scott Card

Three time travelers from a ruined and doomed future Earth journey to the time of Columbus' landing, hoping to alter events so that the contact between the Eastern and Western Hemispheres will be less disastrous for the world. Also try Card's [Enchantment](#).

Time's Eye by Arthur C. Clarke

A mysterious glowing orb appears over Central Asia, ripping the Earth into conflicting eras of the past, present, and future, mingling UN peacekeepers from the year 2037 with military forces from past eras. Also try [The Light of Other Days](#).

1632 by Eric Flint

A mysterious accident in time causes twenty-first-century American democracy to collide head-on with the Thirty Years War in seventeenth-century Germany as Mike Stearn and a group of armed miners take on a gang of strangely attired invaders who are threatening peaceful Grantville, West Virginia. Also try the rest of the *Assisti Shards* series, written by Flint and David Weber, and also [Time Spike](#).

The Accidental Time Machine by Joe Haldeman

MIT research assistant Matt Fuller measures subtle quantum forces that relate to time changes and his calibrator turns into a time machine. With a dead-end job and a girlfriend who has left him for another man, Matt has nothing to lose taking a time machine trip himself - or so he thinks. Also try Haldeman's [Forever War](#).

For Us, the Living: a Comedy of Customs by Robert A. Heinlein

This book, one of the first Heinlein wrote, but not published until well after his death, features a protagonist who dies in a car accident in 1939 and returns to the living in another body in the year 2086, where he must adjust to life in the distant future.

The Time Traders by Andre Norton

Intelligence agents find out the USA's greatest adversary can send its agents back through time. When small-time criminal Ross Murdock and Apache rancher Travis Fox stumble onto America's secret time travel project, they both become time agents, taking the battle to the enemy. Also try [Time Traders II](#) and [Echoes in Time](#).

The Anubis Gates by Tim Powers

A modern authority on the romantic poets leads a tour of time travelers back to 1810 and becomes involved with gypsies, sorcerers, and a variety of other characters.

Night Watch by Terry Pratchett

Sent back in time, Sam Vimes encounters a younger version of himself and gets mistaken for his former commander, a situation that prompts him to change the outcome of a rebellion on Discworld.

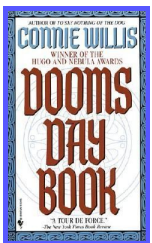
Hyperion by Dan Simmons

A pilgrimage to the realm of the Shrike, a part-god/part-killing machine, provides the travelers the forum to tell their incredible stories relating why they each feel that they must make this pilgrimage. The Hyperion Cantos continues with [Fall of Hyperion](#).

The Time Machine by H.G. Wells

Beginning in the comfortably prosperous world of the Victorian professional classes, a scientist proposes the possibility of traveling in the fourth dimension -Time- and is propelled into the far distant future to find shockingly different "people" living there.





[The Doomsday Book by Connie Willis](#)

A young, twenty-first-century historian travels back in time to the Middle Ages, mistakenly arrives at the time of the Black Death, and becomes stranded there because a virulent influenza epidemic has broken out at the Oxford research facility back where she started. Also try Willis' hilarious romp through the Victorian age in [To Say Nothing of the Dog](#).

[Spin by Robert C. Wilson](#)

In the near future three friends watch the stars go out. Earth has been sealed off from the rest of the galaxy and has been placed in a bubble of suspended animation while time rushes past outside the bubble at a rate fifty-thousand times faster than normal. At this rate, the sun will explode in about fifty Earth years. Also try [Chronoliths](#).

Sometime in the future, a group of students is studying an archaeological site in France when the professor in charge disappears. While uncovering 600-year-old documents from the remains of a monastery, they discover a note dated April 7, 1357, and written in the professor's hand that says "Help me." Also try [Sphere](#).

[The House on the Strand by Daphne du Maurier](#)

In this haunting tale, du Maurier takes a fresh approach to time travel. A secret experimental concoction, once imbibed, allows you to return to the fourteenth century. There is only one catch: if you happen to touch anyone while traveling in the past you will be thrust instantaneously back to the present.

[The Little Book by Selden Edwards](#)

Forty-seven-year-old Wheeler Burden is living in 1988 San Francisco until he is mysteriously transported to fin de siècle Vienna, a city that he finds strangely familiar, where he finds a mentor in Sigmund Freud, falls in love with a young American woman, and gains insight into the war-hero father he never knew.

[The Eyre Affair by Jasper Fforde](#)

In an alternative England, circa 1985, where time travel is routine and dodos are the cloned pet of choice, a world where one can literally get lost in literature, Thursday Next, a Special Operative in literary detection, tries to stop the world's Third Most Wanted criminal from kidnapping characters, including Jane Eyre, from works of literature. [Time and Again by Jack Finney](#)

Simon Morley moves into the Dakota apartments and returns to the year 1882 under hypnosis, where he falls in love and refuses to change records for the government agency controlling his experiment. Also try [From Time To Time](#).

[Outlander by Diana Gabaldon](#)

In Scotland with her husband on a second honeymoon after World War II, Claire enters a circle of stones and is transported back to the Battle of Culloden 200 years earlier, where she must marry a Scot to save her husband. The *Outlander series* continues in [Dragonfly in Amber](#).

[Fallam's Secret by Denise Giardina](#)

Following a strange note left to her by her late uncle, Lydde finds herself transported back to England in 1657, where the ruling Puritans have outlawed all forms of entertainment and where falls in love with a bandit named Raven.

In 1988 43-year-old Jeff Winston died of a heart attack. But then he awoke, and it was 1963; Jeff was 18 all over again, his memory of the next two decades intact. This time around Jeff would gain all the power and wealth he never had before. This time around he'd know how to do it right . . . until next time.
