The Best Gift by Wendy Markham

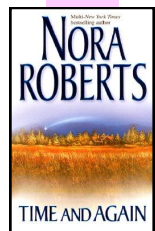
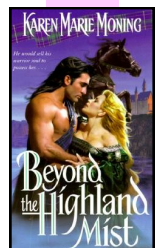
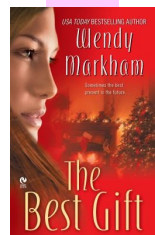
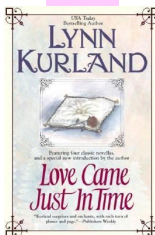
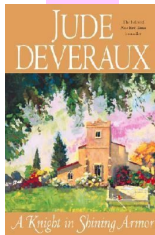
When an earthquake strikes San Francisco and she awakens three years in the future--alone--Clara wonders what happened to her husband, Drew, and to the child she was expecting.

Time and Again by Jack Finney

Illustrator Simon Morley accepts a government assignment that takes him out of his 20th century apartment and transports him back to the streets of New York City in 1882. Simon thoroughly enjoys the experience, falls in love, and works at keeping his actions from altering the course of history. Also try From Time to Time.

Reflections in the Nile by J. Suzanne Frank

After entering an ancient chamber on an archeological dig, Chloe Kingsley is sent back in time to the year 1452 B.C. to the Egyptian court of Hatshepsut and into the body of a corrupt priestess, where she is now forced to face her new environment and the challenges it holds.

Outlander by Diana Gabaldon

In Scotland with her husband on a second honeymoon after World War II, Claire enters a circle of stones and is transported back to the Battle of Culloden 200 years earlier, where she must marry a Scot to save her husband. Also try the rest of the Outlander series.

Warriors: The Time Hunters by Angela Knight

Genetically altered warlord Galar Arvid has been sent back to 2008 to save a pretty Atlanta artist from a Xeran time traveler who intends to kill her for profit, but he does not count on the powerful desire that the artist ignites in him.

The Time Traveler's Wife by Audrey Niffenegger

This debut novel is the story of Clare, a beautiful art student, and Henry, an adventuresome librarian, who have known each other since Clare was six and Henry was thirty-six, and were married when Clare was twenty-three and Henry thirty-one. Impossible but true, because Henry is diagnosed with Chrono-Displacement Disorder: periodically his genetic clock resets and he finds himself misplaced in time, pulled to moments of emotional gravity in his life, past and future. His disappearances are spontaneous, his experiences unpredictable, alternately harrowing and amusing.

Second Glance by Jodi Picoult

Ever since his beloved Aimee was killed in a car accident, Ross Wakeman has deliberately put himself at risk, hoping to die. When nothing works, or brings him any closer to Aimee, he moves in with his sister, Shelby, in Comtosook, Vermont. As chance would have it, strange phenomena are plaguing the town, and Ross is drawn into an investigation of a piece of land that local Abenaki Indians claim is an old burial ground. In the process, he meets lovely Lia Beaumont, who has some mysterious connection to sinister goings-on 70 years before.

Rude Awakenings of a Jane Austen Addict by Laurie Viera Rigler

Jane Mansfield, a gentleman's daughter from Regency England, inexplicably awakens in an overly wired and morally confused L.A. with memories that are not her own and a friend named Wes--who is as attractive and confusing to Jane as the man who broke her heart back home.
