Proposers on this Project are hereby notified that this Addendum shall be attached to and made a part of the above named Request for Proposals dated October 2009.

The following items are issued to add to, modify, and clarify the Proposals documents. Proposals, to be submitted on the specified proposal date, shall conform to the additions and revisions listed herein. Acknowledge receipt of this addendum with the submitted proposal.

Questions & Clarifications

The following is issued in response to questions and clarifications. The comment / question is followed by a response in italics.

1. On page 22 of the RFP, it says, "The proposal shall be segregated into the following sections using labeled dividers." Are we to use the text listed in the under the Table of Contents as the names of the sections or tabs? The names seem to correspond to the bolded headings (1.0 through 10.0, though many of the titles have been abbreviated)? Additionally, is Letter of Interest also to be included as a section, or can it stand alone?

The intent is just as stated above. The proposal should start with the Letter of Interest and the tabs should follow as listed under the term "Table of Contents" and as described in more detail on the following pages. Please ignore the slight wordage variation between what is listed in under Table of Contents and the sections that follow and make use of the heading shown under the Table of Contents.

2. Novartis is referred to within the RFP and the Feasibility Study. Whom should we contact at Novartis to discuss this project?

3. Besides Novartis are there any other organizations expressing interest in the landfill gas?

4. Can you tell me if the engineer (SCS Engineers) that wrote the feasibility report will be allowed to bid on this project?

SCS Engineers or their affiliated companies, SCS Energy or SCS Field Services, will not be allowed to provide proposals on this project as a prime proposer. Though it is unlikely to provide a significant unfair advantage or conflict of interest, SCS has been asked to refrain from being significantly involved in this effort. If a proposer includes SCS as a team member, the County will not automatically disqualify due to this; however, close examination of their role will be evaluated as part of the proposal review.

5. The RFP Document does not define ownership of the Landfill gas to energy facility in the proposal. Who does Wake County expect to own the beneficial reuse facility?

Facilities constructed by the successful Landfill Gas to Energy developer will be owned by the developer for the term of the agreement and any extensions to that agreement.

6. What is the main purpose of the Pre-Submittal Meeting and is there an agenda for the meeting?

An agenda will be provided at the meeting. The purpose of the meeting is to review the expectations of the County for this project and to hear any questions or concerns about the project. Note that space is limited in the meeting room for the pre-proposal meeting so if at all possible, please limit representatives of each potential proposer to one person.

7. Page 14 of RFP Document - Term of Agreement: How many additional 5 year periods will the County have the option to extend the term?

Per NCGS 143-129.2(e)(1) it appears that these types of agreements are limited to a 40 year maximum.
