

Emergency Medical Technician (Intermediate)

Classification Title: Emergency Medical Technician (Intermediate)

FLSA Status: Non-Exempt

BRIEF DESCRIPTION: Provides basic and advanced life support emergency medical care and transportation for the sick and injured.

ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS:

This information is intended to be descriptive of the key responsibilities of the position. The following examples do not identify all duties performed by any single incumbent.

#	Code	Essential Functions
1	M	Inventories supplies and maintains medical and vehicle equipment in good working order. Cleans vehicle and evaluates operational readiness. Restocks supplies after each emergency and non-emergency response.
2	S	Operates emergency vehicles in order to respond and transport sick and injured patients to and from emergency care.
3	M	Interviews patients and bystanders to determine nature of emergency. Interviews and assesses patients for injury and illness. Takes and records vital signs.
4	V	Works with paramedics and performs advanced life support skills utilizing standing order protocols to guide patient care. Lifts and carries equipment, stretchers and patients. Enters information into electronic databases and communicates with emergency providers.
5	M	Maintains station by cleaning, mopping, sweeping and vacuuming. Cleans and dusts surfaces.

Education	Certification as a North Carolina Emergency Medical Technician – Intermediate or eligibility for such certification.

Certification and Other Requirements	A valid driver's license and a "safe" driving record required. Completion of the following certifications within the first 12 months of employment: CPR, Basic Trauma Life Support, Advanced Cardiac Life Support and Pediatric Advanced Life Support.

Supervisory / Organizational Control	No responsibility for the direction or supervision of others.

The purpose of the contact is to address specific issues and/or general policies. Contact may involve support of controversial positions or the negotiation of sensitive issues.
