

Classification Title: Crime Analyst

FLSA Status: Non-Exempt

BRIEF DESCRIPTION: Conducts research and performs analysis of information that is potentially criminal in nature or already deemed to be criminal activity and uncovers and develops relationships within the information. Offers guidance for investigative direction in a particular crime or a group of similar crimes.

ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS:

This information is intended to be descriptive of the key responsibilities of the position. The following examples do not identify all duties performed by any single incumbent.

#	Code	Essential Functions
1	S	Analyzes and evaluates incoming raw data and correlates the information with pertinent existing data to determine if there is a criminal relationship. Manually enters data into software programs designed to generate many types of linkage. Utilizes databases, incident reports, jail data and outside agency information in evaluation process.
2	S	Using available data, designs and publishes analytical products to assist in the investigative process. Maintains credible interaction with Federal, State and Local law enforcement agencies to insure that information flows into the Criminal Intelligence Unit from outside sources.
3	S	Uses existing software to prepare charts, graphs, link analyses, telephone toll analyses, timeline charts and other visual aids for presentations to investigators, prosecutors and courts.
4	S	Conducts background checks and criminal histories on individual crime suspects and compiles data to assist investigators and provide investigative leads. Performs data inquiries, organizes data, and presents data in a manner enabling investigators to conduct casework efficiently.
