- Upcoming Programming: Starting the 1st week in December, there will be Day 2 Day Dad Classes at the Crosby Garfield Center. Day 2 Day Dad is a fatherhood initiative that supports programs and helps serve fathers. This program promotes child-welfare, with programs such as Love Notes (16-24-year-old males), and Child Care Partnerships. There is a Fatherhood Conference in June.
