## POST A PICTURE TO PROMOTE RABIES PREVENTION

[Wake County Animal Center](#) and [Public Health](#) are joining others around the world to participate in [World Rabies Day](#) on Sunday, September 28, 2014, by [sharing information](#) about rabies vaccination and other ways to protect adults, children and pets against rabies.

Citizens are asked to show their support for World Rabies Day by posting a photo with their vaccinated pets on Instagram using the hashtag [#TogetherAgainstRabies](#). Photos tagged [@wakegovpets](#) may be featured in a photo gallery on [wakegov.com](http://wakegov.com) through the end of October.

Prevent rabies by keeping your pet up-to-date on their rabies vaccines. Wake County rabies and microchip clinics offer \$5 rabies vaccines and \$10 microchips. All pets must be in a kennel or on a leash and owners must provide written proof of prior vaccination for 3-year vaccine.
