#ReadytoVote: Wake County Early Voting Expands to 20 Sites

Beginning tomorrow, Oct. 27, Wake County voters will have the opportunity to cast their ballot at one of 20 early voting sites. Eleven new sites will join the 9 that have been open for early voting since Oct. 20.

According to unofficial counts, 64,251 people have voted in the first six days of early voting in Wake County. That's up from approximately 54,000 in the first six days of early voting in the 2012 General Election.

Dates and time for early voting vary by location. Early voting ends at 1 p.m. on Nov. 5. See the full schedule [here](#).

If you forgot to register to vote, you can do same day registration during early voting. You will need to show proof of your current address to register. You will not be able to do same-day registration on Election Day, Nov. 8. Learn about same day registration requirements [here](#).
