Full Moon Hike, Squirrel Spotters, Bark and Buds at Wake County Parks in January

Jan. 13, 5:30-7 p.m. – Full Moon Hike on the ATT at [American Tobacco Trail](#)

Come out to the American Tobacco Trail, drink some hot cocoa and enjoy a full moon. Bring a water bottle and dress for the weather with good walking shoes. The program fee is \$1 per person and [pre-registration is required](#). Meet at the picnic table at the top of the hill at the New Hill Parking Area located at 1309 New Hill-Olive Chapel Road, Apex.

Jan. 20, 8:30-10:30 a.m. or 1:30-3:30 p.m. – Squirrel Spotters at [Lake Crabtree County Park](#)

Park visitors will learn about the quirky traits of the grey squirrels at Lake Crabtree and how they live. Park staff will answer all your gnawing questions about squirrel habits, habitats, and the perils they face. There is no fee for this program but [pre-registration is required](#). Lake Crabtree County Park is located at 1400 Aviation Parkway, Morrisville.

Jan. 21, 11 a.m.-noon – Discover the Park: Walk in the Woods at [Crowder District Park](#)

Take a walk in the woods, and discover the animals and plants that call Crowder District Park home. Help collect data for our Natural Resources Inventory Database and other citizen science projects. All experience levels are welcome. Crowder District Park is located at 4709 Ten-Ten Road, Apex.

Jan. 27, 6-7 p.m. – Family Wildlife Series: Look Whooooo's Talking! at [Blue Jay Point County Park](#)

Join park staff for a night hike to prowl the woods for owls. The program fee is \$1 per person and [pre-registration is required](#). Blue Jay Point County Park is located at 3200 Pleasant Union Church Road, Raleigh.

Jan. 28, 1:30-3:30 p.m. – Adult Workshop: Bark and Buds at [Historic Yates Mill County Park](#)

The leaves have fallen, but you can still learn to identify the trees at Historic Yates Mill County Park by recognizing their bark and buds. After a short presentation on winter tree identification, park visitors will hike into the woods and practice keying out trees by their winter characteristics. This program is for ages 14 years and up. The program fee is \$6 per person and [pre-registration is required](#). Historic Yates Mill County Park is located at 4620 Lake Wheeler Road, Raleigh.
