Celebrate Heritage Day at Historic Oak View County Park

Saturday, Oct. 7, from 10 a.m. until 4 p.m.

Live music, heritage crafts, farm animals, pony rides and much more await visitors during the 2017 Heritage Day celebration at [Historic Oak View County Park](#).

Heritage Day will take place Saturday, Oct. 7, from 10 a.m. until 4 p.m. The free event, presented in partnership with [Wake County Cooperative Extension](#), is open to all ages and celebrates North Carolina's agricultural heritage in the style of an old-time county fair.

Visitors can enjoy the bluegrass and folk music of Chuck and the Waggin'Ears, take carriage rides through the park's pecan grove, and learn about crafts such as blacksmithing, soap making, canning, knitting and quilting. Visitors will also be able to look at a variety of farm animals, antique cars and heritage displays. Children's activities include cane pole fishing, face painting, historic lawn games, pony rides, arts and crafts tables, as well as a farm photo challenge.

The 4-H Youth Fair is also held during Heritage Day, providing a forum for the county's 4-H youth to showcase their skills and crafts.
